Reading and storing the instruction manual

The manufacturer cannot be held liable for damage caused by improper or incorrect usage.

Please note that our equipment has not been designed for use in commercial, trade or industrial applications. Our warranty will be voided if the machine is used in commercial, trade or industrial businesses or for the equivalent purposes.

Safety notes



WARNING!

When using electric tools, basic safety precautions, including the following, should always be followed to reduce the risk of serious personal injury and/or damage to the unit.

General safety

- Keep this instruction manual in a safe place for future reference.
- Read the instructions carefully. Be familiar with the controls and the proper use of the equipment.
- Never allow children or people unfamiliar with these



instructions to use this product.

- Never operate the product while children, other people or pets are nearby. Keep in mind that the operator or user is responsible for accidents or hazards occurring to other people or their property.
- This appliance is not intended for use by persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- Don't use the appliance without reading the instruction manual.
- Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.

Work Area Safety

- Keep the work area clean and well lit. Cluttered or dark areas may cause accidents.
- Do not operate power tools in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust. Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.
- Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool. Distractions can cause you to lose control.

Electrical safety

- Power tool plugs must match the outlet. Never modify the plug in any way. Do not use any adapter plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools. Unmodified plugs and matching outlets will reduce the risk of electric shock.
- Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces, such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators. There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed or grounded.
- Do not expose power tools to rain or wet conditions. Water entering a power tool will increase the risk of electric shock.
- Do not abuse the cord. Never use the cord for carrying, pulling or unplugging the power tool. Keep the cord away from heat, oil, sharp edges or moving parts. Damaged or entangled cords increase the risk of electric shock.
- When operating a power tool outdoors, use an extension cord suitable for outdoor use, to reduce the risk of electric shock.
- Always use this power tool in conjunction with a residual current device (RCD). Use of an RCD reduces the risk of electric shock. The maximum operating current of the RCD must be less than 30mA. If in doubt seek professional advice.
- The voltage indicated on the rating plate must correspond to the voltage of the power source.
- Only use or replace power supply cables for this unit which correspond to the types indicated by the manufacturer. Replacement of power cords must only be undertaken by a suitably qualified person.



- Never touch the mains plug with wet hands.
- Do not run over, crush or pull the power supply cable or extension lead. Protect the cable from heat, oil and sharp edges.
- The extension lead must have a cross section in accordance with the operating instructions and be protected against moisture (see PAGE 15).

Personal Safety

- Stay alert, use caution and use common sense when operating the machine. Do not use the machine while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication.
- Use personal protective equipment. Always wear eye protection. Protective equipment such as dust masks, non-skid safety shoes or hearing protection used for appropriate conditions will reduce the risk of personal injuries. Prevent unintentional starting. Ensure the switch is in the off position before connecting to the power source and/or battery pack, picking up or carrying the tool. Do not carry the machine with your finger on the switch.
- Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times.
- Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery. Keep your hair, clothing and gloves away from moving parts.
- Warning! Switch off and remove the plug from mains before adjusting, cleaning or if the cable is cut, damaged or entangled.
- The machine is double insulated for safety and requires no

earth connection.

- The operating voltage is 230V AC, 50Hz (for non-EU countries 220V, 240V as applicable). If you want to use an extension cable when operating your product, only the following cable dimensions should be used:
 - Ø1.0mm²: max. length 40m
 - Ø 1.5 mm²: max. length 60m
 - Ø 2.5 mm²: max. length 100m .
- If an extension cable is used it must be earthed and connected through the plug to the earth cable of your supply network in accordance with prescribed safety regulations.
- If in doubt contact a qualified electrician or Customer Services. Inadequate extension cables can be dangerous. The extension cable, plug and socket must be of watertight construction and intended for outdoor use.
- It is recommended for increased electrical safety to use a Residual Current Device (RCD) with a tripping current of no more than 30mA. Always check your RCD every time you use it.

Operational Safety

Training

- Read the instructions carefully. Be familiar with the controls and the proper use of the product.
- Never allow people unfamiliar with these instructions or children to use the product. Local regulations can restrict the



age of the operator.

- Keep in mind that the operator or user is responsible for accidents or hazards occurring to other people or their property.

Preparation

- Never operate the product while people, especially children, or pets are nearby.
- Wear eye, ear and mouth protection at all times while operating the product.

Operation

- Do not force the power tool. Use the correct power tool for your application. The correct power tool will do the job better and more safely at the rate for which it was designed.
- Carry the hedge trimmer by the handle with the cutter blade stopped. When transporting or storing the hedge trimmer always fit the cutting device cover. Proper handling of the hedge trimmer will reduce the risk of personal injury from the cutter blades.
- Hold the hedge trimmer properly, e.g. with both hands if two handles are provided. Loss of control can cause personal injury.
- Hold the power tool by the insulated gripping surfaces only, because the cutter blade may contact hidden wiring. Cutter

blades contacting a “live“ wire may make exposed metal parts of the power tool “live“ and could give the operator an electric shock.

- Check the hedge for foreign objects before operation, e.g. wire fences.
- Keep hands and feet away from the cutting devices at all times and especially when switching the product on.
- Do not try to grasp or remove trimmings when the product is running. Only remove trimmings when the product is switched off.
- Check the work area for foreign objects before operation, e.g. wire fences. Take care that the cutting device does not come into contact with wire or other metal objects.
- Never hold the product by the guard.
- Always be sure of a safe and secure operating position, whilst using the product. Always be sure of your footing when using steps and when using your product. Never use the product standing on steps or a ladder. Do not work above shoulder height.
- Store power tools out of the reach of children and do not allow persons unfamiliar with the power tool or these instructions to operate the power tool. Power tools are dangerous in the hands of untrained users.
- Maintain power tools. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts and any other condition that may affect the power tool’s operation. If damaged, have the power tool repaired before use. Many accidents are caused by





- poorly maintained power tools.
- Always ensure the safety guard supplied is fitted before using the product. Never attempt to use an incomplete product or one fitted with an unauthorised modification.
 - Check the cutting device regularly for damage, and if damaged do not use the appliance, but contact the After Sales Support line.
 - Do not overload the product.
 - Check immediately if the product starts to vibrate abnormally. Excessive vibration can cause injury.
 - Keep cutting tools sharp and clean. Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges are less likely to bind and are easier to control.
 - Use the power tool and accessories in accordance with these instructions, taking into account the working conditions and the work to be performed. Use of the power tool for operations different from those intended could result in a hazardous situation.
 - Keep the handle dry, clean and free from oil and grease. Slippery handles do not allow for safe handling and control of the tool in unexpected situations.
 - Use the product only in daylight or good artificial light.
 - Never operate the product with damaged guards or shields or without guards or shields in place.
 - Before use check the controls and correct operation of the product.
 - Before using the product or after any impact, check for signs of

- wear or damage and repair as necessary.
- Always disconnect the product from the power supply (i.e. remove the plug from the power supply):
 - ~ when leaving the product unattended.
 - ~ before clearing a blockage.
 - ~ before checking, cleaning or working on the product.
 - ~ after striking a foreign object.
 - ~ whenever the product starts vibrating abnormally.
 - Take care against injury to feet and hands from the cutting attachment.
 - Always ensure that the air vents are kept clear of debris.
 - Never use replacement parts or accessories not provided or recommended by the manufacturer.
 - Avoid using the product in bad weather conditions especially when there is a risk of lightning.
 - Position the cord so that it will not be caught by the cutting attachment during operation.
 - Disconnect from the power supply when the cord becomes damaged or tangled.
 - If the cord becomes damaged during use, disconnect the cord from the supply immediately. **DO NOT TOUCH THE CORD BEFORE DISCONNECTING THE SUPPLY.**
 - Do not use the product if the cord is damaged or worn. Contact After Sales Support for advice on repair.
 - **Warning!** The cutting elements continue to move after the product is switched off.
 - Keep the extension cord away from the blades at all times. Only



use an extension cord with conductors of no less than 1.0mm², 1.5mm² or 2.0mm², see pages 14/15 for recommended maximum lengths and:

- ~ if rubber insulated, ordinary tough rubber sheathed flexible cord (code designation 60245 IEC 53);
 - ~ if polyvinyl chloride insulated, ordinary polyvinyl chloride sheathed flexible cord (code designation 60227 IEC 53).
- Do not expose the product to rain.
 - Any use not according to these instructions is considered unauthorized use and relieves the manufacturer from his or her legal liability.

Service

- Have your power tools serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts. This will ensure that safety of the power tool is maintained.



Residual risks

- Even if you are operating this product in accordance with all the safety requirements, potential risks of injury and damage remain. The following dangers can arise in connection with the structure and design of this product;

Assembly



WARNING!

Always take care when removing the packaging to prevent damage to you or to the hedge trimmer.

Before taking the hedge trimmer out of the packaging, check all the parts indicated in the manual are in the box. Inspect all the parts for signs of damage. Do not use the hedge trimmer if there is any signs of damage. Contact After Sales Support for advice.

Make sure that the hedge trimmer is not connected with power supply or extension cord before assembly.

Mounting the safety guard

1. Fit the safety guard(3) into position and fix securely with the two screws on both sides of the housing (See FIG B).

Mounting the cord strain relief

Double the extension cord, about a foot from the end. Lead the loop through the hole on the rear safety guard and hook the loop over the cord hook. Gently pull on the cord to ensure that it is firmly attached at the handle (FIG C).



Operation

Switching on/off

1. Remove the blade cover (9) from the cutting device (2) (FIG D).
2. Hold the product with the right hand at the rear handle and with the left hand at the front handle.
3. Press the on/off switch (5) and the front switch lever (4) at the same time to switch on the product (FIG E).
4. Switch the product off by releasing either on/off switch (5) and/or the front switch lever (4).

Cutting

1. Cut and remove branches exceeding the cutting capacity of 16mm using an appropriate pruner before operation.
2. Move the blade lightly in a sweeping motion following the shape of the hedge or shrub. A slight tilt downwards of the blade in the direction of motion is recommended for optimum cutting performance.
3. Do not to rush and do not attempt to cut too much with one stroke of the blade.
4. First cut both sides from the bottom cutting upwards to the top. This will prevent any of the trimmings falling into the



path of the area still to be cut (FIG F).

5. After cutting the sides proceed to the top (FIG G).
6. Cut in a number of stages if the area being cut is particularly long to achieve a better result; smaller trimmings will allow for easy composting (FIG H).



AFTER USE

1. Switch the product off, disconnect it from the power supply and let it cool down.
2. Check, clean and store the product as described below.

Maintenance

1. Always switch the product off, disconnect it from the power supply and let the product cool down before performing inspection, maintenance and cleaning work!
2. Keep the product clean. Remove debris from it after each use and before storage.
3. Regular and proper cleaning will help ensure safe use and prolong the life of the product.
4. Inspect the product before each use for worn or damaged parts. Do not operate it if you find broken or worn parts.



WARNING!

Only perform repairs and maintenance work according to these instructions. All further works must be performed by a qualified specialist.

General

1. Clean the product body with a slightly damp cloth and pH-neutral soap. Use a brush for areas that are hard to reach.
2. In particular clean the air vents after every use with a cloth and brush.



3. Remove stubborn dirt with high pressure air (max. 3 bar).
4. Check for worn or damaged parts. Replace worn parts as necessary or contact After Sales Support for repair before using the product again.
5. Regularly check for obvious defects such as loose, dislodged or damaged cutting device, loose fixings and worn or damaged components.
6. Check that covers and guards are undamaged and correctly fitted. Carry out necessary maintenance or repairs before using the product.
7. This product does not contain any parts that can be repaired by the consumer. Contact a qualified specialist to have it checked and repaired.

Cutting device



WARNING!

Wear safety gloves when working on the cutting device! Use appropriate tools to remove debris e.g. a brush or wooden stick! Never use your bare hands!

1. Keep the cutting blade clean and free of debris. Remove trimmings.

2. Apply a small amount of suitable lubricant along the edge of the cutting device to retain a good cutting performance.
3. Keep the cutting blade sharp. Have a worn or damaged cutting device replaced with a new one of the same type by a qualified specialist.

Power cord

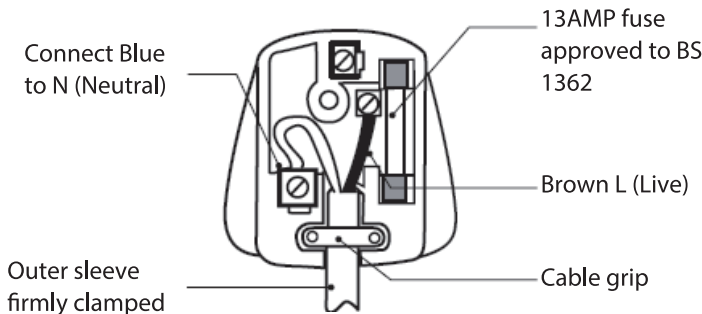
If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

UK plug

If you need to replace the fitted plug, then follow the instructions below.

IMPORTANT: The wires in the mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:

Blue – Neutral, Brown – Live



In case the colours of the wires in the mains lead don't match the colour marking on the terminals, please proceed as follow. Connect the blue wire to the terminal marked N (Neutral) or coloured black. The brown wire must be connected to the terminal marked L or coloured red.

Storage

1. Clean the product as described above.
2. Attach the blade cover.
3. Store the product and its accessories in a dark, dry, frost-free, well-ventilated place.
4. Always store the product in a place that is inaccessible to children. The ideal storage temperature is between 10 and 30°C.
5. We recommend using the original package for storage or covering the product with a suitable cloth or enclosure to protect it against dust.



Troubleshooting



WARNING!

Suspected malfunctions, disturbances or damage is often due to causes that the user can fix themselves. Therefore check the product using this section. In most cases the problem can be solved quickly.

Disposal

Waste disposal

The equipment and its accessories are made of various types of material, such as metal and plastic. Defective components must be disposed of as special waste. Ask your dealer or your local council.

Disposing of the packaging



Dispose of the packaging separated into single type materials. Dispose of cardboard and carton as waste paper and foils via the recyclable material collection service.

Disposing of old devices



Old devices must not be disposed of with household waste!

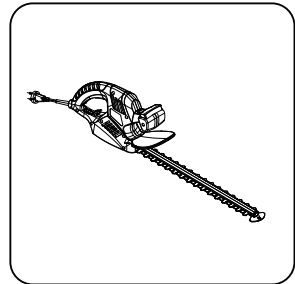
